Call for Posters: Conference on "Challenges in Developmental and Social Research with Immigrant and Minority People"

The Department of Developmental and Social Psychology, Sapienza University of Rome, will host a one-day conference on "Challenges in Developmental and Social Research with Immigrant and Minority People" on November 16, 2019 (2:30 p.m. – 6:00 p.m.). The organizers are inviting contributions for poster submission from academic members (professors, lecturers, researchers, Ph.D. students) of Faculty of Medicine and Psychology.

Relevant topics include (but are by no means limited to) research in developmental and social research with immigrant and minority people: theoretical and empirical research discussing migrant/refugee integration (including refugee children), migrants' social networks, social and organizational psychology, self and social identity, attitudes and persuasion, stereotypes and discrimination, cultural psychology, educational and pedagogical research, human trafficking, immigrant health, immigration law, policies and practices, migration governance. Both quantitative and qualitative methodological approaches are welcome.

The posters will be divided, according to their topic, within the thematic sessions. They will therefore be exposed in the classroom where the related thematic session will be held and authors will be asked to briefly their posters, in a "blitz presentation" mode lasting 5 minutes.

Posters must be in the 80 x100 format with vertical orientation.

FORMAT & REQUIREMENTS: The application consists of a 200-word abstract describing the main research questions, methods, findings and innovative contribution of the proposed research to the "Challenges in Developmental and Social Research with Immigrant and Minority People".

HOW TO SUBMIT ABSTRACT PROPOSALS: Abstract proposals should be submitted via email to Dr. Jessica Pistella, Jessica.pistella@uniroma1it.

APPLICATION DEADLINE: October 15, 2019.

DECISIONS: Decisions will be emailed by October 30.

REGISTRATION: There is no registration fee for this workshop, and some meals will be provided. However, there are no funds available to support travel or lodging for accepted poster presenters.
