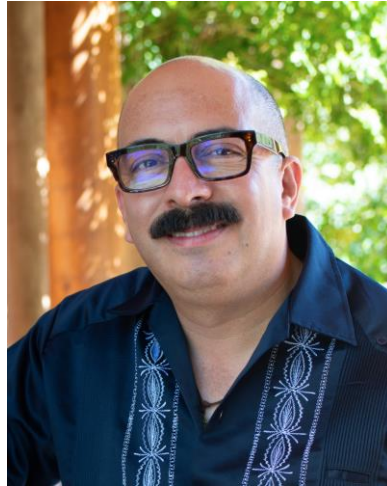

“Queer Latinx Studies: A space of existence in-between”



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The study of Queer Studies in the United States has not been exempted from the intersectional discourses (and complications) created by race and class, as well as those of citizenship and the epistemologies of (mis)representation that define the nation. Jotería[1] Studies (Queer Latinx) come from a space of intersectional distinction and differentiation, of a subjectivity located “in-between,” of a third space of existence. What does it mean to be a queer racialized subject in the US? How are the discourses of emancipation and liberation proposed by US mainstream queer movements tinted by discourses of race, class, and citizenship? How does Jotería Studies approach the “wounds” of violence inflicted by racism and homophobia? This presentation first narrates the history and evolution of Queer Latinx Studies. Then, it presents some of the critical intellectual elements brought forward by the field and some of the most recent developments and challenges.
